PASTORS PEN

Dear Parishioners

We are getting to the end of Lent, and we know that Easter is near. Lent is different from Advent. Advent reminds us of how the world was lost and on its own before Christ came; Lent reminds us of where we are going, and what price was paid for us to go there. In this way Advent is about the past, but Lent is about the future. It should be a time of excitement, and the best way to be excited is to do what we do as an act of love. Then we forget about ourselves.

This Sunday's gospel tells us something we have heard often, that the grain of wheat must fall to the ground and die, if it is to bear fruit – if it doesn't, it remains alone. We think of Jesus' death and resurrection in those terms. If you try to save your life...if you try to hold on to it....if you try to protect it...you are afraid of death. If you lose your life, and let go of it, and detach yourself from it, you accept death. And you are alive. He or she who fears death is already dead. He or she who doesn't fear death is already alive with a new and different life.

Moncef Marzouki is one of the great figures of the political opposition in Tunisia. He is an ardent defender of human rights. He was once questioned by a journalist, a month before the actual crisis in Tunisia. The journalist was Naima Bouteldja. She asked him what gave him the courage to keep up the fight. He explained that he was very impressed in his youth by the image of his grandfather sowing in the desert. After you sow in the desert, he would say, all you can do is wait. When the rain comes, at the end of six months, or a year, or two years, everything flowers, rapidly, abundantly. Even in the desert, he concluded, you must always sow.

Lent is a time for us to die to sins and sow the seeds of virtues!
