PASTORS PEN

Dear Parishioners

We are in the third week of Easter. We celebrate Easter for fifty days because it is the centre of our faith. But how does the resurrection work in us? How does the resurrection transform us? There had to be some attempt at reconciliation or the Mass would sound like hollow words. There would be words of belief but no actions that put those beliefs into practice. How could they pray for the resurrection of their brother if there was not even a glimmer of its transforming power in their own hearts?

The point of today's Gospel is to show us that belief in the resurrection is not enough unless that belief is translated into actions that help us to live as the people of the resurrection – people of joy, happiness and peace. We need to be at peace with God and with one another in order to live the resurrection. We are Christians because of the resurrection. But unless we are open to be transformed by God's words, there is little point in worshipping at Mass.

The Gospel of this third Sunday of Easter tells us of the astonishment of the disciples at this turn of events - Jesus rises to a new life that will be his forever and his defeat is converted into victory. Their joy was unbounded when they realised that this was not a dream, but a reality. The Christ who stood among them was not a ghost, but the living Lord himself.

The victory of Christ was in fact won through his apparent defeat. It was by giving his life for us that he broke the chains of our imprisonment in evil. It was the shedding of his blood that washed away our sins.

We commemorate each year both aspects of Easter. First the suffering and the defeat. Then the victory that has been won through such suffering and dying. Whereas one day, Good Friday, is the day recalling Jesus' suffering, death and defeat, there is a whole liturgical season dedicated to the celebration of his victory. Peace to you all!
