#### **PASTORS PEN**

**Dear Parishioners** 

We are now in the 5th week of Easter. We have been reflecting on many post-resurrection stories from the gospels and Acts of the Apostles. They are stories of lived experience of the disciples with the risen Lord, and of their daily life struggles in the early communities.

In the first reading this Sunday from the Acts of the Apostles, we see Saul (St Paul) visits Jerusalem for the first time after his conversion. He wants to join the disciples. But Saul is shunned and excluded. He is not welcome. He is treated with fear and suspicion, perhaps understandably given his history as a former persecutor of the early Christian community.

But then Barnabas (whose name means "son of encouragement") comes forward. He takes charge of the situation, convinced that Saul had indeed received a divine revelation on the road to Damascus. And so he introduces Paul, and tells his story in the hope of breaking down the barriers. Barnabas models acceptance and inclusion. This eventually persuades the other disciples to accept Saul.

Each of us is called to show practical care and concern for others, whatever their race, colour, religion, appearance or history. Jesus in John's gospel calls himself true vine and we are his branches. All branches get the same source of life from the vine. May our Christ-like love for one another be "not just words or mere talk, but something real and active."
