PASTOR'S PEN

Dear Parishioners

We have two healing stories in Mark's gospel this Sunday. The two healings described in today's gospel passage have much in common. Both the little girl and the old widow share a debilitating vulnerability. The young girl's promising life is cut short – separated from her doting father, personal gifts and qualities undeveloped, no prospect of marriage and children. The old woman knows pain and humiliation. She has spent her savings on doctor's bills with no relief. Her affliction renders her unclean and puts her on the margins of society.

The message of the gospel is: Jesus never gets tired of liberating God's children who reach out to him in faith. The little girl and the woman portrayed in today's gospel also represent two vulnerable sections of our contemporary society that are in need of liberation and claim our Christian compassion.

Jesus's whole life demonstrates compassion and he translates compassion into action. The church and we as individuals, can demonstrate God's love for humanity through our own actions: hearing the cry of the other, and attending to someone else's needs.

The way we greet each other, the way we smile, the way we listen, the way we hold each other in friendship or compassion, are all carrying out the love and healing of Christ.
